A Letter From Our Board President & Executive Director

PACS hit a major milestone in 2022 – 50 years of service to the Phoenixville community. We celebrated with a Casino Night Gala at the Phoenixville YMCA. PACS started in a small office on Gay Street with some donated furniture and a few volunteers. In 2022, we were settled into our new 23,000+ square foot building with offices, a pantry where people can choose the food they need and a warehouse to support food distributed from our building as well as about 17 surrounding organizations. As the lead resource for food insecurity in Phoenixville, PACS distributed food to over 45,000 people just through our doors.

What makes us especially proud to be involved with PACS is how everyone from our staff, volunteers, Board of Directors, and supporters are committed to exploring new ideas to foster food security in Phoenixville by first listening to the people we serve and coming up with creative and effective ways to distribute healthy food in respectful and sensitive ways. We understand not everyone can get to the PACS' doors, so we are always looking for ways to get food to where the people are, whether it's through pop-up locations, delivery service, or via another food provider.

In 2022, we also increased the food we bring in by adding more retail rescue venues, new programs to make individual food donations easier like “A Simple Gesture” that picks up food at the donor's house, and increasing the number of agencies we serve.

We have big plans for what more we can do to serve our community as the need for food continues to grow. Our successes in 2022 showed that our staff, Board members, volunteers and supporters have the passion and commitment to realize our vision for being a model of community feeding community by collaborating with area meal providers and outlets so we can serve our neighbors healthy, nutritious food with dignity and respect.



With your continued support and compassion for our community, we know PACS will serve our community for another 50 years.
