A place that doesn't bear the "stigma" of coming to a food pantry. Each day, we work hard to create a pleasant environment so that every shopper will feel that coming to PACS is the highlight of their day.



This fiscal year we've made great strides, which we know will continue into the next year. There is, though, more to do. PACS is constructing a much needed walk-in refrigeration and freezer unit, but there is more infrastructure work to be accomplished. While we provide food support to 33 local agencies, we're working to set up 24/7 food access through food bins and repurposed newspaper boxes.

A HUGE Milestone

In May 2023, our A Simple Gesture (ASG) program reached over **500 participants** after only two years.

The ASG program is a convenient way for our community to donate from their front porch. When someone subscribes to the ASG program, they receive a GREEN reusable bag to fill every other month. Our Volunteers will pick up the filled bag and bring it to PACS to be sorted by our team.

Every other month, PACS collects roughly 7,000 to 8,000 pounds of food and supplies thanks to the generosity of the community.

Our Impact On Food Insecurity

Serving Our Neighbors:

Our Market receives an average of 150 guests each day, with the average guest collecting food for a family of three. As a result, we serve nearly 450 people daily.


Our Monthly Food Appointments assist roughly 68 families a week, or 288 a month with full grocery orders.

We are proud to serve more than 12 Zip Codes in the surrounding Phoenixville area.

How Much Food Do We Receive?:

Our Retail Rescue alone brought in **550,100 lbs.** of food in FY 22-23; that is **over a half a million pounds** of food that we saved from landfills!

New Changes This Year

INFRASTRUCTURE UPGRADES

In January 2023, Representative Chrissy Houlahan and her team helped us secure a \$1,056,000 grant. This grant will be vital to help us expand our refrigeration capacity and improve our food processing ability. This is important work that will enable us to rescue, store, and distribute more food than ever before. The upgrades will enable us to meet the needs of the increasing number of people we assist on a daily basis. We're extremely grateful to Rep. Chrissy Houlahan, Sen. Bob Casey and everyone who worked hard to secure this grant for PACS.







A CORPORATE SIMPLE GESTURE











Our A Corporate Simple Gesture Program (ACSG) began in January 2023. My goal in starting this program was to develop relationships between PACS and local corporations interested in giving back to the community by assisting those experiencing food insecurity. As of the end of the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year, we had 15 ACSG participants collecting non-perishable food and item donations several times a year. In a short amount of time, the program has grown to include a diverse range of partners. From the Borough of Phoenixville, to residential developments, preschools, churches, store fronts, restaurants, medical offices, and beyond, our program has attracted a wide variety of contributors. We look forward to our new partnerships in the coming fiscal year, as well as greatly appreciate all of our current participants who are making a positive impact in our community to help our neighbors in need.
